He Takes Life Seriously: Long-Term Commitment Is Status Quo for Penn State 2003 Alumni Fellow and Beta Sig Brother, Gene Chaiken '62

Growing Successful Business, Focusing on Family, and Building Philanthropy Are Gene's Core Missions



Gene has worked for Almo Corp. for 45 years. He is generous with his success, having endowed Penn State's study of the holocaust in 2003, a chair in Jewish Studies, and a liberal arts scholarship.

Q. Why did you join the fraternity?

A. My older brother, **Sheldon Chaiken '56**, was a Beta Sig. From the time I was 12-years-old and visited him at the Penn State campus and the fraternity, I knew I wanted to be a Beta Sig. I checked out the other fraternities when I became a Penn State freshman, but there was no question which house was for me.

Q. What was your favorite memory of the fraternity?

A. Just my associations with the other members; the friendships and the times we had together.

Q. What kind of influence has this had on your life?

A. It has had a dramatic influence in my life. My closest friends are all Beta Sigs, and we use each other for

professional networking. The whole experience molded me. Living at the fraternity house made us all grow quickly because of the responsibilities we had to maintain: financially, socially, and morally.

Q. With whom do you stay in contact?

A. I have kept in contact with most of my classmates and some brothers from different graduating years.

Q. Tell us about your family.

A. I married my college sweetheart, Roz Green, the year after I graduated from Penn State and Roz graduated from high school: June 30, 1963. This summer we will have been married 45 years! We have three children: Warren, who received his bachelor's degree from Lafayette College and his M.B.A. from Penn State, and is President and Chief Operating Officer of my company, Almo Corporation; and two daughters. Julie received her bachelor's degree from the University of Massachusetts and her Master's in Education from the University of Pennsylvania. Paula did her undergraduate work at Duke University, and received a Master's of Human Service Administration from Spertus Institute of Chicago and a Master's of Education from the National Louis University of Evanston. All of our children are married and have given us a total of seven grandsons.

Q. What is your nickname and how did your get it?

A. Gene. It's short for Eugene, my full first name.

Q. Did you live at the house? If so, who were your roommates?

A. I lived at the house for three years (my freshman year was spent in the dormitory). I roomed with Wally Kaplan, Steve Klein, Bob Schwartz, Barry Ross, Art Axelrod, Howard Gale, Richard Weissfeld.

Q. What do you do for a living? Tell us about your career.

A. After college, I worked for an accounting firm for four months, then I joined the U.S. Army Reserves in September 1962 and got out in April 1963. I started working for Almo Corporation when I married the owner's daughter. I have been there for 45 years (with a one-year hiatus). Almo is one of the largest distributors of consumer electronics, major appliances, high-end kitchen appliances, and outdoor cooking and living products, as well as industrial wire and cable products throughout the United States. I became president, chairman and CEO of the corporation in 1973. In 2004, Warren took over as president, and I remain chairman and CEO.

Q. What types of public services have you participated in?

A. In 2003, my wife and I funded the Gene and Roz Chaiken Endowment for the Study of the Holocaust at Penn State so that students could be given a more comprehensive approach to one of the greatest human atrocities in recent history. Also, my wife, my brother Sheldon, and I funded the Chaiken Family Chair in Jewish Studies; and the Gene and Roz Chaiken Trustee Scholarship, which provides 40 scholarships a year to needy liberal arts students who minor in business.

I have been a member of the Penn State Development Council, College of the Liberal Arts since 1999, as well as having been involved with the following Penn State organizations: Omicron Delta Kappa Society, Delphi Society; Androcles Society; Skull and Bones Society; member of Thespians; Mt. Nittany Society; and Laurel Society. I was secretary/treasurer of the Interfraternity Council and am an alumni association life member.

I was president of the Beta Alumni Association of Penn State in the '70s, and president of the Beta State Foundation in the '80s and '90s. I was presented with the College of the Liberal Arts Alumni Fellow Award in 2003, an Honorary Doctorate of Laws from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1997 and the Gail Carter Award from the National Electronic Distributors Association in 1986.

Currently, I am vice chairman of the board for the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and am on the board of directors of Bell Micro Products, Inc. I was appointed by Governor Ed Rendell to serve on the Penn State Board of Trustees in May 2005. Previously, from March 2003 until May 2005, I served as the Governor's non-voting representative to the Board.

This past year, I was honored to be a commencement speaker for the Penn State Brandywine campus graduation ceremony.

Q. What hobbies do you enjoy?

A. I love to golf, play with my grandchildren, and take vacations with my family.

Q. What are your goals for the next few years?

A. I plan to continue the transition of leadership to Warren at Almo. I want to work slightly less and spend more time in Florida.
